

# Information Bulletin for Parents/Guardians March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021

Public Health Sudbury and Districts is moving into the grey-lockdown level effective March 12<sup>th</sup> at 12:01 a.m. The decision was made due to the concerning trends in public health indicators and in consultation with the local Medical Officer of Health. As such, all elementary and secondary students who were attending face to face will engage in remote learning from March 15<sup>th</sup> to and including March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021, unless otherwise advised. Should this be extended, we will advise you as soon as possible.

# So, what does this mean for the Elementary Remote Learning School?

There are **no changes** to the remote learning school.

### What does this mean for students enrolled in face to face classes?

- Remote learning starts on Monday, March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 for Kindergarten to Grade 12 students.
- Parents will be contacted by staff on March 15<sup>th</sup> with guidance on how to access the platform and to get started in the virtual classroom.
- Educators will connect online with their class every day.
- Students will follow their regular school timetable. This schedule includes start and end times and recesses.

# What is Synchronous learning?

Learning that happens in real time. It involves using text, video, or voice communication in a way that enables educators and other members of the school or board-based team to instruct and connect with students in real time. Synchronous learning supports the well-being and academic achievement of all students, including students with special education needs, by providing educators and students with an interactive and engaging way to learn. It helps teachers provide immediate feedback to students and enables students to interact with one another.

## What is Asynchronous learning?

Learning that is not delivered in real time. Asynchronous learning may involve students watching prerecorded video lessons, completing assigned tasks or contributing to online discussion boards.

# What will Remote Learning look like?

- Approximately 180 minutes of synchronous learning time will be offered to kindergarten students.
  and 120 minutes of asynchronous learning.
- Approximately 225 minutes of the instructional day will be synchronous learning for students in Grade 1 to Grade 8, and 75 minutes will be delivered asynchronously.
- Students in Grades 9-12 will receive approximately 225 minutes of their course delivered synchronously and 75 minutes asynchronously.
- Our educators will use their professional judgement to provide flexibility to students who cannot fully participate in synchronous learning.
- Teachers will continue to provide various learning experiences, not all of which will require online computer-related instruction.
- Assessment continues during the remote learning period.



# **Student Supports**

- Students with special education needs will continue to be supported by their classroom teacher in the online environment. Students that receive resource or educational assistant support in person will receive similar supports in remote learning.
- On March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021, teachers of special education system classes will contact parents to support their child's ability to participate in a remote learning environment.

#### **Mental Health Resources**

Our School Mental Health team will be reaching out to students and families throughout the week of March 15th to help provide resources and support. In addition, students and families can access further mental health resources, including Kids Help Phone, which offers 24/7 counselling and referral services across the province. # **Looking for Learning Resources?**

The Ministry of Education recently announced the launch of two new portals developed by Ontario certified teachers. **TVO Learn** and **TFO IDÉLLO**, **apprendre à la maison**. Secondary students can access TVO's **Independent Learning Centre (ILC) Open House** and Portes ouvertes pour les cours TVO ILC in French-language, which provides access to 144 Grade 9 to 12 courses.

We also provide a rich array of supports and resources in our Learning Support Hub for parents and students, located at SCDSB Learning Hub.

There will be no student transportation services for either elementary or secondary students from March 15<sup>th</sup> to March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

# **Extended Day Programs**

During the remote learning period, there will be no Extended Day Programs permitted in elementary schools.

## **Child Care Centres in Schools**

At this time, child care centres will remain open in schools.

## **Electronic Device Distribution**

Those students that need a device will be provided one either on Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup> or Monday, March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

# **Student Belongings**

We ask all students to take home their belongings on Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021 (i.e. glasses, medication, shoes and learning materials).
