



Information Bulletin for Parents/Guardians January 3rd, 2022

Earlier today, the Ontario Premier announced that the Province of Ontario will enter a period of public health restrictions beginning on Wednesday, January 5th, 2022. The Ministry of Education has directed that all elementary and secondary students who were attending face to face, will engage in remote learning from January 5th to January 14th, 2022. Face to face students are expected to return to in-person instruction on January 17th, 2022 subject to public health trends and operational considerations.

What does this mean for the Elementary Remote Learning School?

For students who have been enrolled in the remote learning school, classes will resume on Wednesday, January 5th, as scheduled.

What does this mean for students who have been enrolled in-person classes?

- Remote learning will begin on **Wednesday/Thursday** of this week, **for K- 12 students**.
- Parents will be contacted by staff on January 5th with guidance on how to access the platform and when virtual learning will begin. Flexibility is required to deploy the required technology for students to access remote learning.
- Educators will connect online with their class every day.
- Students will follow their regular school timetable. This schedule includes start and end times, as well as recesses.
- In-person classes and transportation are anticipated to resume the week of January 17th, 2022.

What will Remote Learning look like?

- Approximately 60% of the instructional day will be synchronous learning for students in kindergarten and 40% will be delivered asynchronously.
- Approximately 75% of the instructional day will be synchronous learning for students in Grades 1-8, and 25% will be delivered asynchronously.
- Students in Grades 9-12 will receive approximately 80% of their course delivered synchronously and 20% asynchronously.
- Our educators will use their professional judgement to provide flexibility to students who cannot fully participate in synchronous learning.
- Teachers will continue to provide various learning experiences, not all of which will require online computer-related instruction.
- Assessment and evaluation will continue during the remote learning period.

Student Supports

- Students with special education needs will continue to be supported by their classroom teacher in the online environment. Students that receive special education resource support or educational assistant support will receive similar supports in remote learning.
- On January 5th, teachers of special education system classes and kindergarten teachers of students with complex needs will contact parents to support their child's ability to participate in a remote learning environment.

Mental Health Resources

Our School Mental Health team will be reaching out to students and families throughout the week of January 3rd to help provide resources and support. In addition, students and families can access further mental health resources, including Kids Help Phone, which offers 24/7 counselling and referral services across the province. Looking for Learning Resources?

The Ministry of Education is providing two new portals developed by Ontario certified teachers. **TVO Learn** and **TFO IDÉLLO, apprendre à la maison**. Secondary students can access TVO's **Independent Learning Centre (ILC) Open House** and Portes ouvertes pour les cours TVO ILC in French-language, which provides access to 144 Grade 9 to 12 courses.
