# 1. Prayer and welcome

# 2. School Board Update

M. Bellmore (Board Chair) provided a Board update which included the following:

M. Bellmore thanked the members of PIC for their tremendous support and hard work as we all work through the constraints of the pandemic. He indicated how he and the Board of Trustees are extremely grateful for our parents/guardians, our students and our staff.

# a. High efficiency Air Filter Initiative

In addition to upgraded mechanical ventilation systems, and other strategies including running our ventilation systems 2 hours before school and 2 hours after school, by the end of April all classrooms in our system will have standalone HEPA filter units in them.

# COVID-19 Learning Recovery Fund

It is to be used to temporarily support the hiring of additional staffing to address the following: learning recovery and the implementation of the first year of fully de-streamed Grade 9; the delivery of remote learning; supports for special education; and maintaining enhanced cleaning standards.

#### Student Mental Health Investment

The funding will continue to support student mental health for school or school-based mental health staffing, programs, and initiatives.

## Local Special Education Priorities

This allocation may be used to address local priorities such as retraining of additional education, professional, and para-professional staff and the implementation of evidence-based programs and interventions.

#### Parent Reaching Out Grant

Supports boards to work with their Parent Involvement Committees.

#### Well-Being and Mental Health Bundle

Funding to support the board in meeting local needs and priorities that promote and support well-being and inclusive education including strengthening positive school climates.

#### Broadband Network Operations

This funding is to help meet the increasing network demand for digital learning in the classroom and increased network capacity.

# c. Tutoring Program details:

The Ministry of education has provided boards with funding for this spring and next year to support tutoring programs in schools with a focus on literacy and numeracy. This will include:

- Tutors in the Classroom to hire university/college students or recently graduated students. They
  will work in the classroom under the direction of the teacher during the school day to support
  literacy and numeracy.
- After School tutors to hire our own teaching staff to provide after school tutoring with a focus on students' needs in literacy and numeracy.
- Summer school to support the offering of various summer school programs.

## 4. Presentation by Joel Agowissa

J. Agowissa provided a powerful and very informative session that highlighted the history of Turtle Island and brought forward the Indigenous perspective through his teachings. The session provided a perspective on the impact of colonialism and helped us gain a deeper understanding of our shared history. In this White Buffalo Circle Joel also shared how the history of Turtle Island along with the story of the White Buffalo prophecy have influenced the work he is doing in our schools.

#### 5. Parent Series Update

The sessions have been very well-done. To date the following sessions have been offered: Cyber Bullying & Internet safety; Transitioning to Secondary School; and A focus on Literacy.
