Sample Pledges for School Administrators and Teachers

These pledges are intended to inspire school administrators and teachers to commit to taking specific actions that promote accessibility and inclusion for people with disabilities. By writing out these pledges and sharing them on Red Shirt Day™, participants can make a public commitment to creating a more accessible and inclusive school environment.

- I pledge to create an accessibility plan for our school that outlines steps to remove physical barriers and promote accessibility throughout the school.
- I pledge to educate myself and others on disability and accessibility issues, including learning about different types of disabilities and how to provide appropriate support.
- I pledge to ensure that all school events and activities are fully accessible to all students, including those with disabilities.
- I pledge to work with students, families, and community members to create a more inclusive school culture that values and supports all students, regardless of ability.
- I pledge to provide regular training for all staff members on disability awareness and accessibility, including how to support students with disabilities in the classroom and other school settings.
- I pledge to review and update school policies and practices to ensure that they are inclusive of all students, including those with disabilities.
- I pledge to increase the availability of assistive technology and other supports for students with disabilities, such as accessible learning materials and devices.
- I pledge to collaborate with community organizations and disability advocates to create partnerships that promote accessibility and inclusion both in and outside of school.

Sample Pledges for Students

These are just a few examples of the types of pledges that students could commit to on Red Shirt Day™ to promote accessibility and inclusion. It's important to remember that creating a truly inclusive and accessible school environment requires ongoing effort and commitment, so these pledges should be seen as a starting point for ongoing action and improvement.

- I pledge to learn more about different types of disabilities and how to be a better ally to people with disabilities in our school and community.
- I pledge to stand up against bullying and discrimination of all kinds, including against people with disabilities, and to promote a culture of respect and inclusion in our school.
- I pledge to get involved in school activities and events that promote accessibility and inclusion, such as a buddy program or an awareness campaign.
- I pledge to speak up when I see barriers to accessibility or inclusion in our school or community, and to work with others to find solutions.
- I pledge to be patient and understanding with my classmates who have disabilities, and to offer them support and friendship whenever possible.
- I pledge to learn about accessible design and technology, and to advocate for its use in our school and community.
- I pledge to volunteer with organizations that support people with disabilities in our community, and to learn more about how I can make a difference.
- I pledge to encourage my friends and classmates to be more inclusive and welcoming to people with disabilities, and to lead by example.
- I pledge to celebrate the achievements and contributions of people with disabilities in our school and community, and to challenge negative stereotypes and attitudes.

Sample Pledges for General Community Members
