A focus on the three priorities of the Math Action Plan, through the lens of the curriculum and grounded in the strategies outlined in the Ministry document for High Yield Strategies in Mathematics instruction. This framework includes the Mathology Scope and Sequence for Mathematics. Participants will be provided with learning opportunities to support the development of Physical Literacy in their classrooms. Physical Literacy provides a solid foundation for children and youth to develop the skills they need to be active in life. Training for Special Education Resource teachers will also include supporting students with special education needs through the development of the Individual Education Plans.
